YOUR INVESTMENT AT WORK

New Crime Lab Technology Reduces Backlog

Through your generosity, one Hamilton Robot and three EZ2 Connect Extraction Robots were purchased for the Crime Lab. These "robots" made the process of extracting and testing DNA samples more efficient with updated science and technology. This investment resulted in a 55% reduction of the backlog and a 50% reduction in the turnaround time in only a few months of operation.

Not only is the Crime Lab meeting their daily goal of processing DNA cases, but many days they are exceeding it thanks to the new equipment provided by you!



New Bomb and Arson Response Vehicle

The KCPD Bomb and Arson Section is responsible for protecting Kansas City, and 41 other cities and counties in Missouri through mutual agreements. If a critical incident occurs, or a special event is being planned, our detectives from the Bomb and Arson Section are some of the first to be called. Even though they are among the most highly trained personnel in the

Police Department, the job is constantly changing with technology, equipment and current events. In order for them to be able to complete the job we ask of them, to ensure our community's investments are safe, to ensure we are safe, investments were necessary to update their equipment.

KCPD asked for your help and you answered their Call For BackUp. Because of your generosity, to include a \$50,000 leadership contribution from the Jack F. and Glenna Y. Wylie Charitable Foundation and another from an anonymous donor, a three-quarter of a million-dollar order for a new response vehicle was completed this Spring.

Police Training

Not only does the Foundation provide cutting-edge technology to help KCPD do their job, we also recently provided training for KCPD members to continually learn how best to serve our community. ICAT is a training program that provides officers with the tools, skills, and options for successfully and safely defusing a wide range of critical incidents. Another training the Foundation provided funding for is titled Constitutional Policing, Topics covered in this training will be response to resistance, communications skills, community policing, ethics, decision making and risk management. Both training sessions are an investment in KCPD personnel as well as our community.



TECHNOLOGY IMPROVES INVESTIGATIVE EFFICIENCY AND OPPORTUNITIES

3D Investigative Mapping Drones

Current KCPD drones used for investigative purposes would soon be deemed obsolete/ unable to fly in December of this year due to FAA regulations. The Foundation recently purchased two new drones to allow KCPD to use new 3D technology to take aerial photos of crime and crash scenes. The drones have the ability to create To-Scale diagrams using the 3D scanning technology. This will greatly impact scenes that span long-distances and will take a fraction of the time to gather and memorialize the needed information. The KCPD drone operators are FAA Certified Remote Pilots and are covered under KCPD's FAA Certificate of Waiver or Authorization for all law enforcement job functions.



Investigative Software

KCPD Analysts researched and requested new investigative software to enhance the ability to locate and analyze prospective sources of evidence. When testing the software, analysts were able to complete investigations in 20 minutes that previously took 2 days to manually examine. The software also has the ability to generate additional leads for detectives and provide critical intelligence for investigations.

A LETTER FROM CHIEF STACEY GRAVES



It is an honor to lead the men and women of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department who are invested in our city and dedicated to making it safer. As Chief of Police, I am committed to making Kansas City safer for everyone.

I was sworn in as Kansas City's 48th Chief of Police on Dec. 15, 2022, but my service to Kansas City started in 1997 when I began as a records clerk on the 1st floor of Police Headquarters. Over the years and through many experiences, my love for the department and my City intertwined more than I could have imagined. I am thankful to serve my hometown, even more so in this new position.

As Chief of Police, words can't express my thankfulness for the Police Foundation of Kansas City. Support for our police department, from the most influential people in Kansas City, is a gratefulness that is hard to describe. When I took this position, I knew combating violent crime would be the top priority. There is too much violent crime in Kansas City. For decades, violence has harmed all of us. RESTIN PEACE, KCPD Officer James Muhlbauer and K9 Champ


The Kansas City Missouri Police Department lost two of their own on February 15, 2023. The partners were killed in the line of duty when a vehicle struck them while they were on patrol.

Officer James Muhlbauer, 42, was a 20-year veteran of KCPD, serving his entire career as a patrol officer, including the last three years in the K9 Unit. Champ, a Dutch Shepherd, was 3-years-old and joined KCPD as Officer Muhlbauer's partner, one year ago.


